11 AN ACT making appropriations of public money out of the Treasury in
12 accordance with section fifty-one, article VI of the
13 Constitution.

14 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

15 TITLE I—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

16 **Section 1. General policy.**—The purpose of this bill is to
17 appropriate money necessary for the economical and efficient
18 discharge of the duties and responsibilities of the state and its
19 agencies during the fiscal year two thousand nine.

20 **Sec. 2. Definitions.**—For the purpose of this bill:

21 "Governor" shall mean the Governor of the State of West
22 Virginia.

23 "Code" shall mean the Code of West Virginia, one thousand nine
24 hundred thirty-one, as amended.

1 "Spending unit" shall mean the department, bureau, division,
2 office, board, commission, agency or institution to which an
3 appropriation is made.

4 The "fiscal year two thousand nine" shall mean the period from
5 the first day of July, two thousand eight, through the thirtieth day
6 of June, two thousand nine.

7 "General revenue fund" shall mean the general operating fund of
8 the state and includes all moneys received or collected by the state
9 except as provided in section two, article two, chapter twelve of the
10 code or as otherwise provided.

11 "Special revenue funds" shall mean specific revenue sources
12 which by legislative enactments are not required to be accounted for
13 as general revenue, including federal funds.

14 "From collections" shall mean that part of the total
15 appropriation which must be collected by the spending unit to be
16 available for expenditure. If the authorized amount of collections
17 is not collected, the total appropriation for the spending unit shall
18 be reduced automatically by the amount of the deficiency in the
19 collections. If the amount collected exceeds the amount designated
20 "from collections," the excess shall be set aside in a special
21 surplus fund and may be expended for the purpose of the spending unit
22 as provided by article two, chapter eleven-b of the code.

23 **Sec. 3. Classification of appropriations.**—An appropriation for:

24 "Personal services" shall mean salaries, wages and other

25 compensation paid to full-time, part-time and temporary employees of
26 the spending unit but shall not include fees or contractual payments
27 paid to consultants or to independent contractors engaged by the
28 spending unit.

29 Unless otherwise specified, appropriations for "personal
30 services" shall include salaries of heads of spending units.

31 "Annual increment" shall mean funds appropriated for "eligible
32 employees" and shall be disbursed only in accordance with article
33 five, chapter five of the code.

34 Funds appropriated for "annual increment" shall be transferred
35 to "personal services" or other designated items only as required.

36 "Employee benefits" shall mean social security matching,
37 workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, pension and
38 retirement contributions, public employees insurance matching,
39 personnel fees or any other benefit normally paid by the employer as
40 a direct cost of employment. Should the appropriation be
41 insufficient to cover such costs, the remainder of such cost shall
42 be transferred by each spending unit from its "personal services"
43 line item or its "unclassified" line item or other appropriate line
44 item to its "employee benefits" line item. If there is no
45 appropriation for "employee benefits," such costs shall be paid by
46 each spending unit from its "personal services" line item, its
47 "unclassified" line item or other appropriate line item. Each
48 spending unit is hereby authorized and required to make such payments

49 in accordance with the provisions of article two, chapter eleven-b
50 of the code.

51 "BRIM Premiums" shall mean the amount charged as consideration
52 for insurance protection and includes the present value of projected
53 losses and administrative expenses. Premiums are assessed for
54 coverages, as defined in the applicable policies, for claims arising
55 from, inter alia, general liability, wrongful acts, property,
56 professional liability and automobile exposures.

57 Should the appropriation for "BRIM Premiums" be insufficient to
58 cover such cost, the remainder of such costs shall be transferred by
59 each spending unit from its "personal services" line item, its
60 "employee benefit" line item, its "unclassified" line item or any
61 other appropriate line item to "BRIM Premiums" for payment to the
62 Board of Risk and Insurance Management. Each spending unit is hereby
63 authorized and required to make such payments.

64 Each spending unit shall be responsible for all contributions,
65 payments or other costs related to coverage and claims of its
66 employees for unemployment compensation. Such expenditures shall be
67 considered an employee benefit.

68 "Current expenses" shall mean operating costs other than
69 personal services and shall not include equipment, repairs and
70 alterations, buildings or lands.

71 Each spending unit shall be responsible for and charged monthly
72 for all postage meter service and shall reimburse the appropriate

73 revolving fund monthly for all such amounts. Such expenditures shall
74 be considered a current expense.

75 "Equipment" shall mean equipment items which have an appreciable
76 and calculable period of usefulness in excess of one year.

77 "Repairs and alterations" shall mean routine maintenance and
78 repairs to structures and minor improvements to property which do not
79 increase the capital assets.

80 "Buildings" shall include new construction and major alteration
81 of existing structures and the improvement of lands and shall include
82 shelter, support, storage, protection or the improvement of a natural
83 condition.

84 "Lands" shall mean the purchase of real property or interest in
85 real property.

86 "Capital outlay" shall mean and include buildings, lands or
87 buildings and lands, with such category or item of appropriation to
88 remain in effect as provided by section twelve, article three,
89 chapter twelve of the code.

90 From appropriations made to the spending units of state
91 government, upon approval of the governor there may be transferred
92 to a special account an amount sufficient to match federal funds
93 under any federal act.

94 Appropriations classified in any of the above categories shall
95 be expended only for the purposes as defined above and only for the
96 spending units herein designated: *Provided*, That the secretary of

97 each department shall have the authority to transfer within the
98 department those general revenue funds appropriated to the various
99 agencies of the department: *Provided, however,* That no more than
100 five percent of the general revenue funds appropriated to any one
101 agency or board may be transferred to other agencies or boards within
102 the department and no funds so transferred may be transferred to a
103 "personal services" line: *Provided further,* That the secretary of
104 each department and the director, commissioner, executive secretary,
105 superintendent, chairman or any other agency head not governed by a
106 departmental secretary as established by chapter five-f of the code
107 shall have the authority to transfer funds appropriated to "personal
108 services" and "employee benefits" to other lines within the same
109 account and no funds from other lines shall be transferred to the
110 "personal services" line: *And provided further,* That the secretary
111 of each department and the director, commissioner, executive
112 secretary, superintendent, chairman or any other agency head not
113 governed by a departmental secretary as established by chapter five-f
114 of the code shall have the authority to transfer general revenue
115 funds appropriated to "annual increment" to other general revenue
116 accounts within the same department, bureau or commission for the
117 purpose of providing an annual increment in accordance with article
118 five, chapter five of the code: *And provided further,* That no
119 authority exists hereunder to transfer funds into line-items to which
120 no funds are legislatively appropriated: *And provided further,* That

121 if the Legislature by subsequent enactment consolidates agencies,
122 boards or functions, the secretary or other appropriate agency head
123 may transfer the funds formerly appropriated to such agency, board
124 or function in order to implement such consolidation. No funds may
125 be transferred from a Special Revenue Account, dedicated account,
126 capital expenditure account or any other account or fund specifically
127 exempted by the Legislature from transfer, except that the use of the
128 appropriations from the State Road Fund for the office of the
129 Secretary of the Department of Transportation is not a use other than
130 the purpose for which such funds were dedicated and is permitted.

131 Appropriations otherwise classified shall be expended only where
132 the distribution of expenditures for different purposes cannot well
133 be determined in advance or it is necessary or desirable to permit
134 the spending unit the freedom to spend an appropriation for more than
135 one of the above classifications.

136 **Sec. 4. Method of expenditure.**—Money appropriated by this bill,
137 unless otherwise specifically directed, shall be appropriated and
138 expended according to the provisions of article three, chapter twelve
139 of the code or according to any law detailing a procedure
140 specifically limiting that article.

141 **Sec. 5. Maximum expenditures.**—No authority or requirement of
142 law shall be interpreted as requiring or permitting an expenditure
143 in excess of the appropriations set out in this bill.

27 to remain in full force and effect and are hereby reappropriated to
28 June 30, 2009. Any balances so reappropriated may be transferred and
29 credited to the fiscal year 2009 accounts.

30 Upon the written request of the Clerk of the Senate, the auditor
31 shall transfer amounts between items of the total appropriation in
32 order to protect or increase the efficiency of the service.

33 The Clerk of the Senate, with the approval of the president, is
34 authorized to draw his or her requisitions upon the auditor, payable
35 out of the Current Expenses and Contingent Fund of the senate, for any
36 bills for supplies and services that may have been incurred by the
37 senate and not included in the appropriation bill, for supplies and
38 services incurred in preparation for the opening, the conduct of the
39 business and after adjournment of any regular or extraordinary
40 session, and for the necessary operation of the senate offices, the
41 requisitions for which are to be accompanied by bills to be filed with
42 the auditor.

43 The Clerk of the Senate, with the written approval of the
44 president, or the President of the Senate shall have authority to
45 employ such staff personnel during any session of the Legislature as
46 shall be needed in addition to staff personnel authorized by the
47 senate resolution adopted during any such session. The Clerk of the
48 Senate, with the written approval of the president, or the President
49 of the Senate shall have authority to employ such staff personnel
50 between sessions of the Legislature as shall be needed, the

51 compensation of all staff personnel during and between sessions of the
 52 Legislature, notwithstanding any such senate resolution, to be fixed
 53 by the President of the Senate. The clerk is hereby authorized to
 54 draw his or her requisitions upon the auditor for the payment of all
 55 such staff personnel for such services, payable out of the
 56 appropriation for Compensation and Per Diem of Officers and Employees
 57 or Current Expenses and Contingent Fund of the senate.

58 For duties imposed by law and by the senate, the Clerk of the
 59 Senate shall be paid a monthly salary as provided by the senate
 60 resolution, unless increased between sessions under the authority of
 61 the president, payable out of the appropriation for Compensation and
 62 Per Diem of Officers and Employees or Current Expenses and Contingent
 63 Fund of the senate.

64 The distribution of the blue book shall be by the office of the
 65 Clerk of the Senate and shall include seventy-five copies for each
 66 member of the Legislature and two copies for each classified and
 67 approved high school and junior high or middle school and one copy for
 68 each elementary school within the state.

8 The appropriations for the house of delegates for the fiscal year
9 2008 are to remain in full force and effect and are hereby
10 reappropriated to June 30, 2009. Any balances so reappropriated may
11 be transferred and credited to the fiscal year 2009 accounts.

12 Upon the written request of the Clerk of the House of Delegates,
13 the auditor shall transfer amounts between items of the total
14 appropriation in order to protect or increase the efficiency of the
15 service.

16 The Clerk of the House of Delegates, with the approval of the
17 speaker, is authorized to draw his or her requisitions upon the
18 auditor, payable out of the Current Expenses and Contingent Fund of
19 the house of delegates, for any bills for supplies and services that
20 may have been incurred by the house of delegates and not included in
21 the appropriation bill, for bills for services and supplies incurred
22 in preparation for the opening of the session and after adjournment,
23 and for the necessary operation of the house of delegates' offices,
24 the requisitions for which are to be accompanied by bills to be filed
25 with the auditor.

26 The Speaker of the House of Delegates, upon approval of the house
27 committee on rules, shall have authority to employ such staff
28 personnel during and between sessions of the Legislature as shall be

29 needed, in addition to personnel designated in the house resolution,
 30 and the compensation of all personnel shall be as fixed in such house
 31 resolution for the session, or fixed by the speaker, with the approval
 32 of the house committee on rules, during and between sessions of the
 33 Legislature, notwithstanding such house resolution. The Clerk of the
 34 House of Delegates is hereby authorized to draw requisitions upon the
 35 auditor for such services, payable out of the appropriation for the
 36 Compensation and Per Diem of Officers and Employees or Current
 37 Expenses and Contingent Fund of the house of delegates.

38 For duties imposed by law and by the house of delegates,
 39 including salary allowed by law as keeper of the rolls, the Clerk of
 40 the House of Delegates shall be paid a monthly salary as provided in
 41 the house resolution, unless increased between sessions under the
 42 authority of the speaker, with the approval of the house committee on
 43 rules, and payable out of the appropriation for Compensation and Per
 44 Diem of Officers and Employees or Current Expenses and Contingent Fund
 45 of the house of delegates.

17 Upon the written request of the Clerk of the Senate, with the
18 approval of the President of the Senate, and the Clerk of the House
19 of Delegates, with the approval of the Speaker of the House of
20 Delegates, and a copy to the Legislative Auditor, the auditor shall
21 transfer amounts between items of the total appropriation in order to
22 protect or increase the efficiency of the service.

23 The appropriation for the Tax Reduction and Federal Funding
24 Increased Compliance (TRAFFIC) (fund 0175, activity 642) is intended
25 for possible general state tax reductions or the offsetting of any

3 **Sec. 8. Awards for claims against the state.**-There are hereby
 4 appropriated for fiscal year 2009, from the fund as designated, in the
 5 amounts as specified, general revenue funds in the amount of
 6 \$1,886,796, special revenue funds in the amount of \$558,413, and state
 7 road funds in the amount of \$713,890 for payment of claims against the
 8 state.

9 **Sec. 9. Special revenue appropriations.**-There are hereby
 10 appropriated for expenditure during the fiscal year two thousand nine
 11 appropriations made by general law from special revenues which are not
 12 paid into the state fund as general revenue under the provisions of
 13 section two, article two, chapter twelve of the code: *Provided*, That
 14 none of the money so appropriated by this section shall be available
 15 for expenditure except in compliance with and in conformity to the
 16 provisions of articles two and three, chapter twelve and article two,
 17 chapter eleven-b of the code, unless the spending unit has filed with
 18 the director of the budget and the legislative auditor prior to the
 19 beginning of each fiscal year:

20 (a) An estimate of the amount and sources of all revenues accruing
 21 to such fund;

22 (b) A detailed expenditure schedule showing for what purposes the
 23 fund is to be expended.

24 **Sec. 10. State improvement fund appropriations.**-Bequests or

25 donations of nonpublic funds, received by the governor on behalf of
26 the state during the fiscal year two thousand nine, for the purpose of
27 making studies and recommendations relative to improvements of the
28 administration and management of spending units in the executive
29 branch of state government, shall be deposited in the state treasury
30 in a separate account therein designated state improvement fund.

31 There are hereby appropriated all moneys so deposited during the
32 fiscal year two thousand nine to be expended as authorized by the
33 governor, for such studies and recommendations which may encompass any
34 problems of organization, procedures, systems, functions, powers or
35 duties of a state spending unit in the executive branch, or the
36 betterment of the economic, social, educational, health and general
37 welfare of the state or its citizens.

38 **Sec. 11. Specific funds and collection accounts.**-A fund or
39 collection account which by law is dedicated to a specific use is
40 hereby appropriated in sufficient amount to meet all lawful demands
41 upon the fund or collection account and shall be expended according to
42 the provisions of article three, chapter twelve of the code.

43 **Sec. 12. Appropriations for refunding erroneous payment.**-Money that
44 has been erroneously paid into the state treasury is hereby
45 appropriated out of the fund into which it was paid, for refund to the
46 proper person.

47 When the officer authorized by law to collect money for the state
48 finds that a sum has been erroneously paid, he or she shall issue his

49 or her requisition upon the auditor for the refunding of the proper
50 amount. The auditor shall issue his or her warrant to the treasurer
51 and the treasurer shall pay the warrant out of the fund into which the
52 amount was originally paid.

53 **Sec. 13. Sinking fund deficiencies.**-There is hereby appropriated
54 to the governor a sufficient amount to meet any deficiencies that may
55 arise in the mortgage finance bond insurance fund of the West Virginia
56 housing development fund which is under the supervision and control of
57 the municipal bond commission as provided by section twenty-b, article
58 eighteen, chapter thirty-one of the code, or in the funds of the
59 municipal bond commission because of the failure of any state agency
60 for either general obligation or revenue bonds or any local taxing
61 district for general obligation bonds to remit funds necessary for the
62 payment of interest and sinking fund requirements. The governor is
63 authorized to transfer from time to time such amounts to the municipal
64 bond commission as may be necessary for these purposes.

65 The municipal bond commission shall reimburse the state of West
66 Virginia through the governor from the first remittance collected from
67 the West Virginia housing development fund or from any state agency or
68 local taxing district for which the governor advanced funds, with
69 interest at the rate carried by the bonds for security or payment of
70 which the advance was made.

71 **Sec. 14. Appropriations for local governments.**-There are hereby
72 appropriated for payment to counties, districts and municipal

73 corporations such amounts as will be necessary to pay taxes due
74 counties, districts and municipal corporations and which have been
75 paid into the treasury:

76 (a) For redemption of lands;

77 (b) By public service corporations;

78 (c) For tax forfeitures.

79 **Sec. 15. Total appropriations.**-Where only a total sum is
80 appropriated to a spending unit, the total sum shall include personal
81 services, annual increment, employee benefits, current expenses,
82 repairs and alterations, equipment and capital outlay, where not
83 otherwise specifically provided and except as otherwise provided in
84 TITLE I-GENERAL PROVISIONS, Sec. 3.

85 **Sec. 16. General school fund.**-The balance of the proceeds of the
86 general school fund remaining after the payment of the appropriations
87 made by this act is appropriated for expenditure in accordance with
88 section sixteen, article nine-a, chapter eighteen of the code.

TITLE III-ADMINISTRATION.

1 **Section 1. Appropriations conditional.**-The expenditure of the
2 appropriations made by this act, except those appropriations made to
3 the legislative and judicial branches of the state government, are
4 conditioned upon the compliance by the spending unit with the
5 requirements of article two, chapter eleven-b of the code.

6 Where spending units or parts of spending units have been absorbed
7 by or combined with other spending units, it is the intent of this act

8 that appropriations and reappropriations shall be to the succeeding or
9 later spending unit created, unless otherwise indicated.

10 **Sec. 2. Constitutionality.**-If any part of this act is declared
11 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, its decision
12 shall not affect any portion of this act which remains, but the
13 remaining portion shall be in full force and effect as if the portion
14 declared unconstitutional had never been a part of the act.
